SPECIAL TAX ELECTION FOR
DRAINAGE SERVICES

B97 Shall the County of San Luis Obispo continue to provide drainage services to the community of Los Osos, specifically San Luis Obispo County Service Area No. 9, Zone J, by adopting and imposing a special tax not to exceed sixteen dollars (\$16.00) per parcel per year, on all real property within the boundaries of Zone J, which special tax shall be levied by the Board of Supervisors annually, commencing with fiscal year 1997-98?

SWIMMING POOL SERVICES

D97 Shall the County of San Luis Obispo continue to provide services to design, develop, construct, maintain and operate a community swimming pool for Los Osos by adopting and imposing a special tax of \$8.00 per unit of benefit per year on real property, based on actual land use, within the boundaries of County Service Area No. 9, Zone B, which may increase up to two percent per year for inflation of operation and maintenance costs?
